Pastor's Pondering

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ – I am alive, albeit croaking like a frog. Thank you for all your patience, prayers, and well wishes as I recover from this wicked upper respiratory illness that slammed down on me like a foot crushing a flower. I still can't hear very well; everything inside my body sounds extremely loud, while outside noise and conversation are extremely soft. The exception to that is my electric tooth brush which now sounds like a jet engine!

Martin and I want to thank all of you for your care and compassion as we have mourned the loss of Martin's dad, Dean Reed. We have been comforted by your prayers, cards, and conversation. We appreciate being able to travel to Arizona where we had a lovely time with Martin's brothers and sister, and step-mom. The people of Bethany are truly lovely, kind, and gracious people; we are so pleased and privileged to be among you.

We are now in the season of Lent – a time for reflecting on Jesus – Who is he? What has he done? What motivated God to do this thing in Jesus? Why do I care? Why does God care? What is my sin? What is love? How is any of this relevant in my life and in the life of the people of Bethany?

The Transfiguration of Jesus is the turning point where Jesus turns to face the cross. Comforted, emboldened, and sustained by the transfiguration event, Jesus turns back down the hill to get down and dirty with the church establishment, with the clamoring people – because people have God in a box where they think they can control and manipulate God; and they are missing the living God in their midst. So Jesus turns over the money tables of the Temple and turns over the conventions of faith in order to shake people out of their pre-conceived notions about who God is and how God works. Are you ready to be shaken up? Are you open to turning towards God and away from pre-conceived notions of how God "should" be? Do you want to engage, envision, and entertain the living God in our midst?

I hope so, for Lent leads to the climax of Christmas, which is the cross and the resurrection on Easter Sunday. To not participate in the Lenten experience diminishes our spiritual capacity to accompany Christ on this journey to the cross; we miss opportunities to be mentored in the Christian faith by Christ himself.

So please plan on continuing your Lenten experience by going to the mid-week Lenten worship services at Palestine Lutheran Church. It is an annual exercise for the people of Nazareth Lutheran Church, Palestine Lutheran Church, and we folk at Bethany to share fellowship over a meal, then have worship and conversation together during Lent. Supper is at 5:30 – 6:30-ish with worship beginning at 7pm. This year we will build our worship and small group discussion questions around the movie, "Godspell." So come and be a part of a fun and challenging Lenten experience. See you soon.

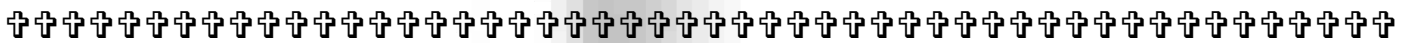
Mid-Week Lenten Services

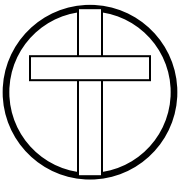

This April we have the privilege of welcoming to Iowa four members from our sister companion, Hedaru Lutheran Parish in Hedaru, Tanzania. Our friends will be arriving in Ames on April 25th and staying through May 18th. While they are here, we want them to meet a diverse group of Iowa Lutherans and experience all that makes our communities and state one of a kind.

A large part of what makes Iowa special is our church families, including you and your congregation. We hope you will consider being a part of this very unique occasion. While our visitors will be spending the majority of their time in the Central Iowa area, specifically in Ames, we would like to give them a chance to visit the rest of the Synod for a few days, if arrangements can be made. We have hosted Tanzanians from other churches at St. Andrew's before, and have always found it to be a deeply rewarding experience, so we are inviting others to share in this opportunity.

How might this look?

- 1) If you are near Ames, we would love to welcome you in joining us in activities we will be doing, and are happy to put you on a contact list so that you know the schedule of events.
- 2) If you would be interested in hosting our visitors for a few days in your church and with your congregation's families, and show them around your community, we would be willing to discuss those arrangements. It would involve a little more commitment of resources from your end, including housing, transportation, visits to see local points of interest, and help with general expenses. If you do not have a companionship and are interested in one in the future, this could be a great way to help your congregation get a taste of what this program is about. When we have hosted people here, we have always found that the fund-raising was easy and people were very excited to be involved and give of their time.

If this sounds like something that your church could benefit from, it would be our pleasure to include you in our companions' visit. I hope you will consider joining us and sharing not only in fellowship but also in the wonderful experience companionship has to offer.

Angel Food Ministries

Angel Food Ministries is a non-profit, non-denominational organization dedicated to providing grocery relief and financial support to communities throughout the United States. The program began in 1994 with 34 families in Monroe, Georgia (between Atlanta and Athens), and has grown to serve hundreds of thousands of families every month across 35 states. Angel Food Ministries crosses denominational lines and has spread the good news of the gospel of Christ through salvation tracts that are placed in each food order.

Blessings by the box

Angel Food is available in a quantity that can fit into a medium-sized box at \$30 per unit. Each month's menu is different than the previous month and consists of both fresh and frozen items with an average retail value of approximately \$60. Comparison shopping has been done across the country in various communities using a wide range of retail grocery stores and has resulted in the same food items costing from between \$42 and \$78.

Generally, one unit of food assists in feeding a family of four for about one week or a single senior citizen for almost a month. The food is all the same high quality one could purchase at a grocery store. There are no second-hand items, no damaged or out-dated goods, no dented cans without labels, no day-old breads and no produce that is almost too ripe.

Also offered are specialty boxes such as steaks, chicken and pork. Many participants in this bonus program appreciate the expanded choices. Additionally, there is no limit to the number of units or bonus foods an individual can receive, and there are no applications to complete or qualifications to which participants must adhere. Angel Food Ministries also participates in the U.S. Food Stamp program, using the Off-Line Food Stamp Voucher system.
